Code of conduct for parents/carers

This club hopes that as a parent/carer you will support your child's participation in cricket by:

- Encouraging your child to learn the rules of the sport and to play within them.
- Discouraging unfair play and arguing with officials.
- Helping your child to recognise good performance and not just results.
- Never forcing your child to participate.
- Setting a good example, recognising fair play and applauding good performances of all.
- Never punishing or belittling a child for losing or making mistakes.
- Publicly accepting the judgments of umpires.
- Supporting your child's involvement and helping them to enjoy playing cricket.
- Using correct and proper language at all times.
- Encouraging and guiding your child to accept responsibility for his/her own performance and behaviour.

Code of conduct for junior members

Annfield Plain Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members. The club believes it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should at all times show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with the club's officials. Details of the officials are on the club noticeboard in the clubhouse.

As a member of Annfield Plain Cricket Club you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager. Abdominal protection, pads, gloves and protective headwear must always be worn when batting.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.

PHOTOGRAPHY, TRANSPORT AND CHANGING ROOMS

Permission for the use of photographs and recorded images

Annfield Plain Cricket Club ('The Club') recognises the need to ensure the welfare and safety of all young people in cricket. As part of this commitment we will not permit photographs, video images or other images of young people to be taken or used without the consent of the parent/guardian and the young player. The club will follow the guidance issued by the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) on the use of images of young people which is available on <http://www.ecb.co.uk>. The club will take steps to ensure that these images are used solely for the purpose they are intended, which is the promotion and celebration of the club's cricketing activities. If you become aware that these images are being used inappropriately you should inform the club's Welfare Officer immediately.

If photographs e.g. team or action shots, are submitted to the press or published on the club website individuals will not be identified. In circumstances where there is a need to identify an individual player in the press parental permission will be sought beforehand.

Please note: the club understands that there are circumstances under which a parent would not wish their child to be photographed. Whilst the club will do all that it can to ensure the safety of children during games. It is the responsibility of the parent concerned to ensure that if necessary their child is not videoed or photographed. The club is unable to supervise individual children during cricket activities or competitions.

Transport to matches and practice sessions

This club's policy is that parents or other responsible adults are responsible for transporting players to and from all matches and practice sessions and therefore the club will not be registering private vehicles for the transportation of individuals in connection with any fixtures or practice sessions arranged by the club. The implementation of this policy is not intended to exclude any player from participation and parents or guardians should contact the club's Welfare Officer if they have any problems with the transportation of players to matches or practice sessions.

Club Changing Policy

All parents must be aware that there are circumstances under which players under the age of 16 years may find themselves changing clothes in the presence of persons over 18 years. The club requests that if any parent is not comfortable with this arrangement then it is their responsibility to ensure the following:

- Young players who do not wish to change or shower with adults are under no obligation to do so and are advised to change and shower at home.
- Parental consent must be given if young players are to share changing facilities with adults.
- It is the responsibility of the parent concerned to ensure that their child does not enter changing facilities at any time if consent is not given.

Consent Form

This form has been produced for parents and guardians of young cricketers to complete prior to playing in any matches for Annfield Plain Cricket Club. It gives the necessary authority to the Club to take care of your children during cricket matches. Please note that in signing this form parental rights are not affected in any way.

Dates and venues of matches are those contained in the Northumberland and Tyneside Senior League Handbook and any other fixtures as displayed on the Club notice board. The arrangements for departure will be displayed on the notice board unless individual special arrangements are made.
